



COVID – 19 Employer Measures Cheat Sheet

New Rules April 1st, 2020

If your business is considered critical you must:

- Ensure separation of one to two metres between all persons within the business and follow additional measures to ensure the safety and health of your staff and customers.
- Screen and encourage employees to NOT attend work if they are feeling unwell or demonstrating symptoms

Maintain Clean Facilities & Vehicles

- Post signage throughout the workplace
- Encourage proper cough etiquette and hand hygiene
- Regularly clean all touched surfaces frequently
- Remove papers and other objects that cannot be cleaned from common spaces
- Ensure proper ventilation
- Disinfect all vehicles being dropped off and picked up, including keys
- · Leave doors open if possible, to reduce people having to touch door parts
- Use PPE where appropriate
- Wear gloves when handling vehicles, and plastic seats

Use Social Distancing to Conduct Business

- Encourage virtual communication and meetings
- Discontinue non-essential work-related travel outside of Manitoba.
- Vet customers over the phone for recent travel or illness, prior to in person appointments
- Separate chairs in customer waiting areas or place lines on floor
- · Assess separation of workstations and shop bays
- Tape floor lines to ensure 2-meter separation
- Limit entry into facilities stagger customer and contractor appointments
- Consider only using vans for shuttle purposes.
- Allow only one customer per shuttle vehicle customer to sit at farthest seat from driver.
- Shuttle vehicles are to be disinfected after each trip.

Handling Money

- Try to accept only contactless forms of payment
- Post signage stating you will no longer be accepting cash
- If cashless payment is not possible, wear gloves and always wash your hands after handling cash
- Consider cleaning polymer bank notes with a bit of soap and water since they are resistant to moisture.

Safety

- Have you Conducted a risk assessment of your operations limiting exposure for public and staff?
- Developed Safe Work Procedures for limiting spread of COVID
- Communicated measures to your staff each time process or rules change?
